VOALA specialized programs help veterans without shelter get back on their feet. Veterans often miss the structure and sense of team the military provides, and adapting to civilian life can be difficult for numerous reasons. Nationally, nearly 40,000 veterans are without shelter on any given night. California has the highest estimated number of veterans experiencing homelessness, with almost 11,000 living without any shelter—and more than 3,000 homeless veterans residing in Los Angeles County alone.

But statistics don't tell the whole story. Veterans risk becoming homeless for multiple reasons. PTSD, substance use disorders and mental health issues, unemployment, depression and anxiety, traumatic brain injuries, and a lack of affordable housing are all potential contributing factors.

VOALA can help.

“VOALA is always here to provide services that help veterans get back on their feet,” said Ryan Grady, VOALA Assistant Director of Operations.

“We're here to help veterans overcome the barriers between them and stability and security.”

VOALA cares for each veteran as a whole person, providing compassionate, specialized services that meet Veterans' unique needs. And VOALA not only provides emergency, transitional, and permanent housing. Veterans also receive specialized support that may include case management, life skills counseling, employment training and referrals, financial assistance, treatment for substance use and mental health disorders, and help with obtaining VA benefits.

“You think your situation is too much, and you'll never find a solution. Sometimes you just need a little help,” said Eli, a veteran who experienced homelessness. “VOALA will guide you along.”

What is West Nile Virus?

West Nile virus (WNV) is a disease of wild birds transmitted through the bite of an infected mosquito to people. WNV is a potentially deadly disease that shows up in our communities every year.

To avoid disease, you must avoid bites. Use screens to keep mosquitoes outside and apply repellents when you go outdoors.

Repellents containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, and some oil of lemon eucalyptus products provide longer- lasting protection.

Mosquitoes can lay eggs in the smallest places – even a bottle cap! Look inside your home and yard for anything that can hold water such as vases, buckets, and plant saucers to name a few.

Identify all the containers and TIP the water into the grass once a week and TOSS out unused containers or store them to prevent them from collecting water in the future.

Yard Sales in Unincorporated Los Angeles County

Lately, there has been questions regarding what is necessary to have a yard sale, what items can be sold and/or when can residents have yard sales.

Hacienda Heights is unincorporated, there is an ordinance for Unincorporated Los Angeles County.

Designated Weekends Year 2023:

January 28-29

February 25-26

1. WHEN can yard sales be conducted? Yard sales are only allowed on designated weekends—the last full weekend (Saturday and Sunday) of each month. Hours: 7:00 am - 6:00 pm

** Non-Designated Weekends: Up to two additional weekends per year allowed.
Registration is required. Registration is free.

2. WHO can conduct yard sales? Only the property owners or residents of the dwelling unit where the sale is taking place can conduct yard sales.

3. WHAT can be-sold at yard sales? You can only sell secondhand, household, or incidental personal items. **Sale of new retail merchandise, food, and drinks is prohibited.

4. WHERE can yards sales be conducted? You may conduct sales at any residence within the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County. **You can only place items within the front and side yard of the residence.

5. Signage and items are prohibited in the public sidewalk; parkway, street, and alley. You may place two onsite signs up to 4 sq ft each in area within the front and side yards.

NOTE: If you reside in a duplex or multi-unit building, you are required to provide proof showing which unit you reside in, such as a utility bill.

- **Homeless outreach**--Union Station Homeless Services, provides Housing Navigation services to Hacienda Heights and surrounding areas. This includes outreach to individuals who are literally homeless, engaging them and building relationships, identifying barriers to housing, and developing personalized plans to overcome each of these barriers. Nonconforming Vehicles Ordinance

Residents continue to have concerns with Nonconforming Vehicles being parked on public streets, parks and close to residential areas, schools. This concern was previously presented to Supervisor Solis' office, and it may need to be revisited for possible solutions.

Is there an existing ordinance in Los Angeles Unincorporated areas?

The County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors has adopted an ordinance restricting the parking of Nonconforming Vehicles in the unincorporated communities of Long Beach, South Whittier, East Whittier, East La Mirada, West Whittier/Los Nietos, and Whittier.

The ordinance restricts the parking of Nonconforming Vehicles on public roadways at all times unless a permit is displayed on the vehicle. Each permit will be valid for one day (24-hours). Owners of Nonconforming Vehicles may receive up to 30 permits per year from the local Los Angeles County Sheriff's station. Permits may not be used for more than two consecutive 24-hour periods (for a maximum of 48 hours, at a time).
