TRAFFIC COLLISIONS

• 2023 Traffic Collisions Year-to Date (YTD):
As of January 1, 2023, there are approximately **136** crashes reported.
There was a total of **596** traffic collisions reported in 2022.

• Monthly Traffic Collisions:

March 2023: There was a total of **38** traffic collisions compared to February of 2023 with a total of **43** traffic collisions. Traffic collisions *decreased by 11%*.

• <u>Current Month Collisions-to-date:</u>
As of April 17, 2023, there have been **13** traffic collision reported (completed).

The CHP Santa Fe Springs Area, in partnership with Los Altos High School, the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District Police Department, Industry Sheriff Station, Los Angeles County Fire Department, and many other organizations, we were able to successfully produce the Every 15 Minutes program (impaired driver education) to the Junior and Senior Classes of Los Altos High School. This program was a two day program highlighting the dangers of impaired driving and providing impactful testimonials and information for our students.

The CHP Santa Fe Springs Area is starting a NEW SENIOR VOLUNTEER Program! Interested in serving your local CHP office? Are you 55 years or older? Available for 4 hours a week? This program is for you!

CHP Santa Fe Springs Area has a total of 10 officers in training at various phases in their training program. The first four trainees will be on their own by late April and early May with the remaining six on patrol by July!

The Santa Fe Springs Area has three Officers assigned to our Community Outreach and Program Services unit. These Officers are on special assignment, and provide specific enforcement to our school zone areas, and traffic complaints as well as community activities which include parade details.

COMMUNITY WORKSHOP/PRESENTATION HIGHLIGHT

The California Highway Patrol Santa Fe Springs Area provides numerous workshops/presentations available to our local community. *This portion of the discussion will highlight one of the many programs available*.

Impact Teen Drivers

Impact Teen Drivers (ITD) is a non-profit program focused on saving teen lives through education. The program is designed for attendance by teens with their parents. ITD provides education on the causes of collisions among teen drivers with a strong focus on distractions and risky driving behaviors behind the wheel as well as an explanation of the Graduated Driver License (GDL) requirements.

Included in the presentation are affected family members who have lost a loved one in a teen involved collision. Their stories not only share a tragedy in a way that is emotionally impactful, they also bring home the message of how easy these tragedies are to avoid simply by removing distractions, driving responsibly, and following the GDL restrictions.
