TRAFFIC COLLISIONS

• 2022 Traffic Collisions Year-to Date (YTD):
As of January 1, 2023, there are approximately **94** crashes reported.
There was a total of **596** traffic collisions reported in 2022.

• Monthly Traffic Collisions:

February 2023: There was a total of **43** traffic collisions compared to January of 2023 with a total of **40** traffic collisions. Traffic collisions *increased by* **7%**.

• <u>Current Month Collisions-to-date:</u>
As of March 15, 2023, there have been **11** traffic collision reported (completed).

This program was a two day program highlighting the dangers of impaired driving and providing impactful testimonials and information for our students.

CHP Santa Fe Springs Area has a total of 10 officers in training at various phases in their training program. The first four trainees will be on their own by late April and early May with the remaining six on patrol by July!

The Santa Fe Springs Area has three Officers assigned to our Community Outreach and Program Services unit. These Officers are on special assignment, and provide specific enforcement to our school zone areas, and traffic complaints as well as community activities which include parade details.

Child Safety Car Seat Program


Buckling up is the single most effective thing you can do to protect yourself and your passengers in a crash. It is extremely important to make sure all children riding in your car be properly secured before every trip.
