#### **HISTORY**

#### A LOOK BACK OVER THE HISTORY OF THE HHIA

As the celebration of our 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of HHIA approaches, it is interesting to look back over how our community has changed over the years and what part HHIA has had in guiding its development.

During Spanish rule, Hacienda Heights was a part of Rancho La Puente operated by nearby Mission San Gabriel. John Rowland and William Workman acquired the rancho in 1845 as a Mexican land grant. The Lucky Baldwin family ultimately acquired the land which was sold in 1912 to Edwin Hart and Jet Torrance who subdivided the area and named it North Whittier. The land produced avocado, citrus and walnut orchards.

Our organization had its beginning when the North Whittier Heights Association was established on June 12, 1914. An article in the Los Angeles Evening Herald reported that the "Purchasers in North Whittier (as Hacienda Heights was called at the time) citrus and walnut land subdivision held a meeting... at which time they organized the North Whittier Heights Improvement Association" (NWHIA). At the meeting they established "committees... to make plans for citrus, walnut and vegetable packing houses and a cannery...". During the Great Depression, citrus growing became unprofitable and the area gradually developed as a suburb in the Los Angeles region. The NWHIA was incorporated in February of 1955. In October of 1962 Incorporation Documents were amended changing the name to the "Hacienda Heights Improvement Association" (HHIA). Since that time, HHIA has become the representative of our community with the County of Los Angeles. We now have a population of over 54,841 (2020 census) and an area of 11.2 miles.

The Association through its 75 years has worked to Improve our community and to live up to the motto "Growing with Pride" seen on the entrance signs to our Unincorporated Area. HHIA has long fought battles over the creation & expansion of the Puente Hills Landfill and now supports the planning for the future passive Landfill Regional Park.


HHIA in the 1980's worked with the South Coast Air Quality Management District (ACMD) on emission standards and violations of regulations by the Puente Hills Landfill and Quemetco, the lead/acid battery recycling plant located in the City of Industry within a few hundred feet of residents in Hacienda Heights.

HHIA fought over the years to remove power poles from Hacienda Blvd. with replacement underground and in having plantings to beautify the walls along Stimson Ave. and Hacienda Blvd. We also advocated for saving and maintaining palm trees on Hacienda Blvd. We were successful in having sound walls along the Pomona freeway to protect residents from noise and pollution. The HHIA guided the County in the revision of our Community Plan, aided the County in the Parks Need Assessment, and worked with LA County Dept. of Parks & Recreation in creating a Dog Park. The HHIA remains involved with organizations planning the future in Active Transportation, Housing Development, and Interim & Supportive Housing. The HHIA remains involved with many organizations to include but not limited to: Hillside Open Spaces Education Coalition, City of La Habra Heights – Public Safety / Emergency Preparedness Committee, Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority, East San Gabriel Valley Area Planning, Puente Hills Landfill Park, Hills For Everyone, and San Gabriel Valley Coalition of Governments.

We will continue to advocate for the future of our community. Please help us in this endeavor by supporting HHIA, coming to meetings, and working with us in the coming years.



North Whittier Heights remained a subdivision of citrus and avocado groves for decades afterward with a massive change occurring, as throughout the region, with the post-World War II population and development boom. Tract homes began to appear by 1960, around the time that the name of the community was changed to Hacienda Heights, apparently in reference to the "hacienda" that was the Workman Homestead and now the Homestead Museum.




