TRAFFIC COLLISIONS

- **Traffic Collisions in 2021:** There were a total of 567 crashes.
- **2022 Traffic Collisions Year-to Date (YTD):** As of January 1, 2022, there are approximately 336 crashes reported.
- **Monthly Traffic Collisions:** There were 48 crashes in Hacienda Heights during July 2022, compared to 51 crashes during June 2022. Crashes were down 9%.
- **August Collision to-date:** As of August 1st, there were 9 crashes.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS

- Traffic complaint on Vallecito Drive near Los Altos and La Subida Drive for overweight limit and not stopping at "STOP" sign – an enforcement operation was conducted on 8/7 & 8/9, a total of 24 citations and 2 verbal warnings were issued.
- Traffic complaint on Turnbull Canyon Road for excessive speed – Officer patrol the area on the morning of 8/5 & 8/8, no speeding violation observed.

TRAFFIC SAFETY TIPS

- As summer vacation come to an end, we prepare for back-to-school.
- Before going back to school, take some time to drive around the campus and familiar yourself with drop-off and pick-up schedule/location.
- Please remember to slow down in school zones (25 mph). Do not double park or drop off students in red zones.
- DO NOT let your child/children dart across the street between cars. Always use crosswalk and look both ways before crossing the street.

- Always have your child/children exit the vehicle onto a sidewalk and never into the street (traffic side).
- If you are walking, running, biking, or skating, to school, please remember to wear something bright and visible. ALWAYS travel in the same direction as traffic. ALWAYS wear a helmet when you are riding or skating.
- DO NOT leave your child/children or pets in a hot car.
