**DOG PARK FOR HACIENDA HEIGHTS**

In Joan Licari's Environmental Report for May, she wrote about our meeting with County officials, as well as one of the Park Managers, Jaheel Dixas, regarding the proposed selection of Schabarum Park as a potential dog park. Since that time, I have received the criteria (from Alina Bokde) for the County's choice of a dog park, and I had concerns about their selection of Schabarum Park. I have sent my questions to Alina Bokde, Deputy Director, and she has responded that they will review my concerns. Since then, I have spoken with Park Manager, Jaheel Dixas, and his current understanding is the County has changed their mind about the original proposed site in the Park and they are trying to determine another location in Schabarum. If it does end up in Schabarum, we have received agreement that a special reduced price will be made available to dog walkers who want to come to the park on the weekends. Since the cost is usually \$6.00 per day on Saturdays and Sundays, the park will issue an annual pass for \$25.00. As soon as I receive word on what decision has been made about a location for our dog park, I will let everyone know.
