

## **HHIA - Utility 2018 Annual Report**

It has been a tough year for all California residents as far as the water shortage is concerns; starting June to November, water level has been hitting record low every single day in San Gabriel Key Well Level, and hit historical low on Nov. 21, 2018 @ 169.10 feet, merely 57.37% comparing to high level of 295.30 back in July 20, 1983.

Although we had some moderate rainfall in December, conserving water should be not only our way of life, but also our obligation while population keeps on growing. I will keep on tracking the water level and remind awareness of the situation.

We also have a few meetings regarding the spreading Cell Tower in Hacienda Heights from different carriers. While possible radiation that could cause unknown sickness, and anti-aesthetic city landscape are of major concerns, carriers claim that all constructions are in compliance with FCC, with advantages include internet reception and connection, especially during emergencies, stay in communication could save lives. My personal comment is that instead of each carrier seeking their own sites, is it possible that city (or county) designate certain sites for all carriers, this way, carriers are sharing the cost of shared tower instead of individual tower, it can also save the landscape issue at the same time.
