**6 PUBLIC SAFETY & LAW ENFORCEMENT UPDATES:**

- a. Los Angeles Sheriff Department** – Deputy J. Ruano shared that there is a new station Lieutenant. crime statistics related to HH. his observation that he felt the use of illegal fireworks seemed to be down from last year. Member questions: if the homicide in La Puente took resources away from HH. he said no; does LASD monitor Nextdoor postings, Deputy Ruano said he reads them however does not use the page for replvng. Lucy Pedregon presented Deputy Ruano with a Certificate of Appreciation,, for his assistance with the Jim Davis Beautification Day event.

- b. **California Highway Patrol**– Officer J. Tolen shared statistics specific to HH and some statistics related to the area the Santa Fe Springs CHP office covers. Ofc. Tolen provided Scott Martin with an email containing statistics. He shared that the August HHIA meeting will be his last and hopes he will present his replacement in that meeting; he is transferring to an Orange County station.

**7 PRESENTATION: “Road to 2020” (2020 Census)** by Helen Lim, Partner Specialist, U.S. Census Bureau. Mrs. Lim shared that there are three (3) reasons why the census takes place. 1. The U.S. Constitution cites that the United States has to collect population data, 2. Provides the power of having two Senators per state and addresses redistricting, and 3. Money comes along with the number of people counted. An average of \$675 billion will be apportioned based on numbers so an accurate count helps States, Counties, and Cities. Employment opportunities will be available to help with the 2020 Census ([www.2020census.gov/jobs](http://www.2020census.gov/jobs)).
