“Conserving Water”

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About two years ago the state of California was declared in a “state of drought” by Governor Jerry Brown. That meant the drought crisis would be message to the people through every means of media. The drought has now impacted and affected the water usage in our homes.

The San Gabriel Valley Water Company mailed to all residence information regarding the water drought regulations as approved by the “California Public Utilities Commission” rule no. 14.1 (Water shortage contingency plan). Property is measured by Ccf (cubic feet) for water usage per month. All residence have been assigned landscape watering limited to two days per week. They are as follows;

- *Monday and Thursday for street addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, or 8.
- *Tuesday and Friday for all other street addresses.
- *Water 10 minutes per station/area.
- *Water your landscape in the afterhours of 5:00 P.M. and no later than 9:00 A.M., or water by with a hose nozzle any time of the day on your assigned days.
- *Turn off your sprinklers during rain and 48 hours after rain.

One may water with a hand held nozzle hose or by bucket. These restrictions do not apply to recycled water or gray water. Gray water refers to bath water one collects after a tub or shower. These are Los Angeles County regulations. Cities have program different regulations.

In the meantime, conserve water by;

1. Repairing water leaks.
2. Using a hand held nozzle hose to wash your car.
3. Sweeping sidewalks and driveways.
4. Make sure sprinklers are directed to plants & grass, not sidewalks, gutters & curbs.
