- 1. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER:** Time is 7:00 P.M. in the school district conference room by Mike Williams, President.

- 5. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:** Jim Kleinpell motioned to approve the minutes and Joan Licari seconded the motion.
- 6. PUBLIC SAFETY & LAW ENFORCEMENT UPDATES:**
 - a. California Highway Patrol: Officer Al Perez, in place for Officer Jeremy Tolen, from Santa Fe Springs area. Officer Perez reported someone was found impersonating an officer who stopped a female driver and touched her inappropriately. A private citizen provided a description of the suspect from a similar incident. Good news! The Sante Fe CHP Department received 14 new officers! As for citations, there were 30 DUI's and 45 unlicensed drivers cited. As for overall statistics from September to October, there were 1, 500 traffic citations. Regarding street line markings, white lines follow the same rule as yellow lines. A double line means no crossing at all. White lines are used in the Orange County area and are gradually being used in the Los Angeles area. The CHP Toy Drive will be active until December 22nd.

b. **LASD Town Sheriff: Deputy Jose Ruano.** Deputy Ruano discuss vehicle and residential burglaries. Re: vehicles. He advises to keep valuables in the trunk of the car where they are not visible to attract criminals. Do lock the glove compartment too! As for residential advice, do not respond to loud knocks at the door, avoid contact. Instead, call the sheriff department for suspicious visitors. Deputy Ruano reports there was 1 assault, 2 robberies and 8 residential breaking and entering which includes daytime crime. Overall, crime in Hacienda Heights is down compared to 2016. He reminds all “If you see something, say something”. Call 626 330-3322 but do not call 411. Deputy Ruano spoke at a Neighborhood Watch block meeting. Urged all to take precaution to keep safe.

c. **Mountains Recreation & Conservation Authority: Ranger Francine Godoy.** Ranger Godoy announced there are changes in the 7th & Orangegrove Trailhead. She offered education and alternative routes regarding the trails which is scheduled on November 27th. The project for the trailhead is open for ADA users on the second week of December due to repairs. The MRCA now have a Trail Watchers program that will watch and observe hikers.
