

Meet Deputy Jose Ruano, LA County Sheriff's Department

Hacienda Heights 'Town Sheriff'



Deputy Ruano has been assigned to Industry Station since December 2016. In his capacity as Hacienda Height's Town Sheriff, he oversees the activities of 25 Neighborhood Watch Groups that have a membership of approximately 400 residents. The community members and Neighborhood Watch groups discuss crime related concerns and address quality-of-life issues. Deputy Ruano also co-chairs the Industry Station Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meetings which partner with Law Enforcement to address community issues and find solutions to long-term problems.

Deputy Ruano is also responsible for coordinating public safety deployment for numerous annual community events such as, the Hsi Lai Temple's annual Chinese New Year celebration, Annual St. John Vienney Church Carnival, the Annual Hacienda Heights 'I love America' 4th of July Parade, and oversees the Hacienda Heights Trail Task Force. Deputy Ruano has been a Law Enforcement Officer for 11 years. He has worked in the custody and patrol divisions and has extensive experience and training in various aspects of narcotic suppression. Previous to this assignment he worked as a Town Sheriff for a local city, served as a member of a Summer Violence Crime Suppression Team, on a Graffiti Task Force, and organized/leads neighborhood watch meetings.

Deputy Ruano attends functions at Hacienda Heights schools wherever he can share a message on crime prevention, stopping bullying, and how to make a home and neighborhood a safe place to live. He is seen here at Kwis Elementary for 'National Read Across America Day' which was held in March. Many of the events he attends also include Career Day and college fairs.

Hacienda Heights Fire Station

Hacienda Heights Fire Station 91 sits nestled along a residential area near Turnbull Canyon. What appears to be a quiet and quaint station is staffed daily with four firefighters on a 24 hour basis. Firefighters here are prepared to respond to this wildland interface area as well as responding to many different types of emergency and non-emergency calls.



In addition, the Hacienda Heights Community receives services from Fire Station 43 on Stimson and Fire Station 118 on Gale. Station 43 is home to one of the Fire Departments four Hazardous Materials Squads, also known as HAZMAT 43. With a crew of nine firefighters, Station 43 personnel respond to emergency/medical calls, fires, and incidents involving hazardous materials.

Fire Station 118 also supports Hacienda Heights and neighboring area with nine firefighters, an engine, quint (ladder truck) and paramedic squad.





When they're not responding to emergency calls, the three stations are active in the Hacienda Heights community and are always ready to lend a helping hand. Support for community partners and programs have included: The Hacienda Heights Women's Club, Los Altos High School's Every 15 Minutes program, Hsi Lai Temple, safety presentations at local church's, Hands Only CPR training, visits to local schools, and proud participants in the Hacienda Heights 4th of July Parade.





A look Back Over the History of the HHIA

As the celebration of our 70th anniversary of HHIA approaches, it is interesting to look back over how our community has changed over the years and what part HHIA has had in its guiding its development.

During Spanish rule, Hacienda Heights was a part of Rancho La Puente operated by nearby Mission San Gabriel. John Rowland and William Workman acquired the rancho in 1845 as a Mexican land grant. The Lucky" Baldwin family ultimately acquired the land which was sold in 1912 to Edwin Hart and Jet Torrance who subdivided the area and named it North Whittier. The land was known for avocado, citrus and walnut orchards. (Wikipedia)

Our organization had its beginning when the North Whittier Improvement Association was established on June 12,1914. An article in the Los Angeles Evening Herald reported that the "Purchasers in North Whittier (as Hacienda Heights was called at the time) citrus and walnut land subdivision held a meeting....at which time they organized the North Whittier Heights Improvement association". At the meeting thev established "committeesto make plans for citrus, walnut and vegetable packing houses and a cannery....". During the Great Depression, citrus growing became unprofitable and the area gradually developed as a suburb in the Los Angeles region.

In 1947 Edwin Dow & other local activists reactivated the North Whittier Heights Improvement Association. The North Whittier Heights Improvement Association was Incorportated in 1955. The organization was renamed Hacienda Heights Improvement Association in December 1961. Since that time, HHIA represents our community with the County of Los Angeles and we now have over 54,000 residents and an area of 11.2 miles.

The Association through its 70 years has worked to make our community a better place to live and to live up to the motto "Growing with Pride" seen on our entrance signs. HHIA has long fought battles over the expansion of the Puente Hills Landfill and over what materials could be disposed at the facility. When information about 14,000 tons of untreated being ash disposed of monthly in the landfill became known, \$90,000 were raised for court fees against the dump.

Jeff Yann on the HHIA Board encouraged the Sanitation District's participation in Waste to Energy Gasification—burning of methane gas generated by the decomposition of garbage that now provides electricity to 70,000 homes and that will continue for many years. HHIA was involved in the "Dump the Dump" opposition in 1979 and in 1986, HHIA won a court case against the Sanitation District, halting the installation of two mass burn incinerators, in large part because of the projected impact to air quality in the region.

HHIA in the 1980s worked with the South Coast Air Quality Management District on emission standards and violations of regulations by the Puente Hills Landfill and Quemetco, the lead/acid battery recycling plant located in the City of Industry within a few hundred feet of residents in Hacienda Heights. In 1981 when the Landfill was enlarged to 1,365 acres to become the largest sanitary landfill in the U.S., HHIA representatives founded the Citizens Advisory Committee to advocate to the Sanitation District on community concerns.

In last negotiations for permit extension by the landfill, HHIA was instrumental in requiring closure in 2013 and the provision of a \$1 per ton fee for disposal of waste at the site. These funds are used by the Puente Hills Native Habitat Authority to purchase and manage the open space that forms our southern boundary for wildlife, for recreation, and as open space in perpetuity.

HHIA fought over the years to remove power poles from Hacienda Blvd. with replacement underground and in having plantings to beautify the walls along Stimson Ave. and Hacienda Blvd. We also advocated for saving and maintaining palm trees on Hacienda Blvd. We were successful in having sound walls along the Pomona freeway to protect residents from noise and pollution. Recently, HHIA guided the County in the development of our Community Plan, aided the County in the Parks Need Assessment, and worked with L.A. County Dept, of Parks and Recreation on plans for a future regional park on the now closed Puente Hills Landfill.

We will continue to advocate for the future of our community . Help us in this endeavor by supporting HHIA, coming to meetings, and working with us in the coming years.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Hacienda Heights Improvement Association was incorporated to provide a conduit of information on behalf of the residents of Hacienda Heights and government agencies that provide services to our unincorporated community. Its Board of Directors holds monthly public meetings to allow any resident of Hacienda Heights to raise concerns or suggest improvements that would enhance life in this community. Board members are drawn from broad areas of interest and typically represent many neighborhoods to assure personal awareness of a given situation. In addition to assisting community members in resolving issues that are of concern to them, HHIA's board members have worked diligently on their own to improve the aesthetics and quality of life for our residents. A brief listing of these areas includes the following:

- 1. Placement of power lines along Hacienda Blvd. underground
- 2. Leader of community opposition to expansion of the Puente Hills Landfill adjacent to Hacienda Heights residences and schools
- 3. Protection of residents and schools from impacts of Puente Hills Landfill expansion
- 4. Defeat of proposal to construct a trash incinerator in the hills above Seventh Avenue.
- 5. Advocacy for Community Enhancement funding from landfill expansion
- 6. Improvement of Seventh Avenue Trailhead
- 7. Construction of two recreational trails accessible from Seventh Avenue and Orange Grove Avenue.
- 8. Implementation of Orange Grove Park
- 9. Organized lawsuit to compensate residents near PHLF for loss of property value
- 10. Proposed conceptual plans for screening unsightly block walls along Hacienda Blvd.
- 11. Construction of sound walls to protect residents living adjacent to Pomona Freeway
- 12. Representation on multiple agencies seeking to protect wildlands adjacent to Hacienda Heights
- 13. Organization of Jim Davis Beautification Day
- 14. Implementation of Adult Business Overlay Zone in City of Industry
- 15. Organized opposition to building dedicated truck lanes adjacent to Pomona Freeway
- 16. Organize community response to Conditional Use Permits for significant projects in Hacienda Heights
- 17. Participation in development of the Hacienda Heights Community Plan
- 18. Instrumental in the October 31, 2013 closure of the Puente Hills Landfill
- 19. Advocated for more parks in Hacienda Heights including a Dog Park
- 20. Restoration, maintenance and increased use of the Puente Hills for recreation, hiking and biking.
- 21. HHIA is the point organization from which the County seeks input regarding future projects in Hacienda Heights

MISSION OF HHIA

Hacienda Heights Improvement Association (HHIA) is a private non-profit association with a twelve member volunteer Board of directors. HHIA was formed in 1948 and incorporated in 1955. Its mission statement is:

- 1. To foster and support those projects of improvement and development that will make Hacienda Heights a better place in which to live, and to do all things lawful and necessary and needful in connection therewith.
- 2. To develop and foster proper zoning and land use in the Hacienda Heights Unincorporated Community, assist the Los Angeles County Regional Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors in studies, zone change requests, and other matters pertaining to land use in our area.
- 3. To unite in interest all of the property owners and residents of Hacienda Heights for the purpose of creating (non-partisan) community interest, and to effect a combined influence on matters pertaining to the development and welfare of Hacienda Heights.

JIM DAVIS BEAUTIFICATION DAY

What better way to prepare a parade route than to clean it up and that effort was initially coordinated by Jim Davis, a past Hacienda Heights Improvement Association President (1995 – 1997) in advance of the Annual I Love America 4th of July Parade. After the untimely death of Jim, the HHIA Board continued this volunteer cleaning of the streets on the Saturday before 4th of July, and subsequently the tradition of doing this each year was named after Jim Davis. This tradition gathers civic minded residents and organizations from Hacienda Heights in a show of pride and unity to clean the route where the annul parade travels. The Jim Davis Beautification Day continues because of the efforts of community leaders, Boy Scouts of America troops, church groups, LDS youth groups, local high schools, to name a number who support this effort. Over the years as many as 250 people supported this effort. The streets that are cleaned include Stimson (Colima to



Gale), Hacienda Blvd (Colima to Gale), Vallecito (Las Lomitas to La Subida), Turnbull Canyon (Los Robles to Gale), La Monde (Hacienda Blvd to Stimson), and Halliburton (Hacienda to Stimson). We cannot forget to also thank LA County Public Works staff who supplied safety vests, gloves, and heavy-duty plastic bags for the trash. Public Works staff collected all of the significant number of bags full of leaves, trash, and discarded paper goods.

"I LOVE AMERICA" 4th of JULY PARADE

In 1988, the first parade committee, headed by Nancy Abbott and the late Barbara Fish, with support from the Kiwanis, met to plan a parade for Hacienda Heights. The HHIA has held a tradition to participate in every parade showing its support by simply marching, pulling decorated trailers, riding in boats, and riding in trucks. HHIA's very first entry shared a theme on recycling with three board members dressing like trashcans. That same year a number of Chinese students, studying abroad and living with American families also marched in the parade. In every entry the colors of our American flag were displayed largely and proudly. Some of HHIA's awards for its entries over the years include, but are not limited to, the Sweepstakes Award in 1996 for a

Circus theme, General Class Award in 2011, and the Specialty Award in 2012.

Parades are an American tradition, a time to capture the spirit of our Nation engulfed in Red, White, and Blue, taking over streets where children with wide eyes see colors and pageantry and excited adults will reflect back to times throughout our Nation's history when 4th of July parades honored our heroes fighting wars and those who have fallen to protect our right to gather for such a time honored tradition.





Who We Are

The Habitat Authority is a public agency, Joint Powers Authority with a Board of Directors consisting of the City of Whittier, County of Los Angeles, Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County, and the Hacienda Heights Improvement Association. The Habitat Authority came into existence in 1994 as a condition of approval for the Puente Hills Landfill, its main funding source.

The Habitat Authority's jurisdiction extends within eastern Los Angeles County approximately from the intersection of the 605 and 60 Freeways in the west to Harbor Boulevard in the east.

To date, the Habitat Authority manages approximately 3,870 acres of preserved public open space, of which 1,878 is owned by the Habitat Authority. The remaining lands are either owned by the City of Whittier or the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County. Ultimately it is hoped that over 4,000 acres will be preserved. The Habitat Authority's main focus since inception has been acquisition of the remaining open space within its jurisdiction with special consideration given to the Hacienda Heights area. The thinking is that we need to acquire what is left before it is not available any more. We also engage in many other very important activities such as Preserve Management and Natural Resource Management, and provide many other valuable services such as Outreach and Trail Access.


