Christmas Light safety tips: Many artificial trees are fire resistant. Look for a statement specifying this protection.

- A fresh tree will stay green longer and be less of a fire hazard. To check for freshness, remember: A fresh tree is green. Fresh needles are hard to pull from branches. When bent between your fingers, fresh needles do not break. The trunk butt of a fresh tree is sticky with resin. When the trunk of a tree is bounced on the ground, a shower of falling needles shows the tree is too dry. -
- Place tree away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources. Heated rooms dry trees out rapidly, creating fire hazards. –
- Cut off about two inches of the trunk to expose fresh wood for better water absorption. Trim away branches as necessary to set tree trunk in the base of a sturdy, water-holding stand with wide spread feet. Keep the stand filled with water while the tree is indoors. —
- Place the tree out of the way of traffic and do not block doorways. U
- Use thin guy-wires to secure a large tree to walls or ceiling. These wires are almost invisible. –
- Turn off all lights on trees and other decorations when you go to bed or leave the house. Lights could short and start a fire
